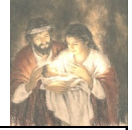

The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph



First Week of Christmas

The **Sunday that follows Christmas** is always the celebration of **The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph**. It is also the second day in the eight days of celebrating Christmas. There are wonderful readings from the **Book of Sirach**, the **First Book of Samuel**, Paul's letter to the **Colossians** or the **First Letter of John**. The gospel from **Matthew** is the story of the angel appearing to Joseph in a dream, telling him to flee with Mary and their newborn son, Jesus, to Egypt so Herod could not find them. After a time, they returned and lived in Nazareth, "so that what had been spoken through the prophets might be fulfilled, he shall be called a Nazorean." Continuing our special feasts in the days after Christmas, Monday is the **Feast of St. John, the Evangelist**. We begin reading the **First Letter of St. John** for the first reading this week.

Tuesday is the moving **Feast of the Holy Innocents**, remembering the infant martyrs of Herod's jealous rage. Wednesday is the **Fifth Day in the Octave of Christmas**. We have the story of the Purification in the temple and the powerful words of Simeon about Jesus and about Mary.

Thursday, **the Sixth Day in the Octave of Christmas**, is the story from Luke's Gospel of Joseph and Mary meeting the prophetess, Anna in the Temple who gives thanks to God for the child, Jesus "to all who were awaiting the redemption of Jerusalem."

Friday is the **Seventh Day in the Octave of Christmas**. The Gospel is the beginning of **John's Gospel**.

Saturday, New Year's Day is the **Solemnity of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Mother of God** and also the **Naming of the Child, Jesus**, a special day for the Society of Jesus. In addition, it is a celebration of **World Day of Prayer for Peace**.

On Sunday, January 2, the US will celebrate the **Epiphany of the Lord**, although most of the world will celebrate it on Wednesday, January 6. The Epiphany celebrates the light that has come into the darkness of the world and that our salvation was made known to the Gentiles. Outside of the US, the **Second Sunday of Christmas** is celebrated, with the beginning of John's Gospel and its poetic images of light and the Word.

Baptism: At least one godparent must be a practicing Catholic. Parents and godparents must attend a Baptism class. To register, call the church office.

Marriage: Couples contemplating marriage should meet with the priest at least eight months prior to the date of the celebration. No date can be reserved until the pre-nuptial investigation has been completed.

Reconciliation: Sunday and Wednesday 10 minutes before mass, or by appointment.

Anointing of the Sick: Anointing of the Sick is for the comfort and strength of the ill, especially the aged. It is not just for those in the immediate danger of death. The sacraments are celebrated for the living. When someone you love is homebound or hospitalized, please let us know so arrangements can be made to minister to them.

You Are the Church in Your Home Baptism brings all Christians into union with God. Your family life is sacred because family relationships confirm and deepen this union and allow the Lord to work through you. The profound and the ordinary moments of daily life—mealtimes, workdays, vacations, expressions of love and intimacy, household chores, caring for a sick child or elderly parent, and even conflicts over things like how to celebrate holidays, discipline children, or spend money—all are the threads from which you can weave a pattern of holiness. Jesus promised to be where two or three are gathered in his name (cf. Mt 18:20). We give the name church to the people whom the Lord gathers, who strive to follow his way of love, and through whose lives his saving presence is made known. A family is our first community and the most basic way in which the Lord gathers us, forms us, and acts in the world. The early Church expressed this truth by calling the Christian family a domestic church or church of the home. This marvelous teaching was underemphasized for centuries but reintroduced by the Second Vatican Council. Today we are still uncovering its rich treasure. The point of the teaching is simple, yet profound. As Christian families, you not only belong to the Church, but your daily life is a true expression of the Church.
