Sacraments

Baptism: At least one godparent must be a practicing Catholic. Parents and godparents must attend a Baptism class. To register, call the church office.

Marriage: Couples contemplating marriage should meet with the priest at least eight months prior to the date of the celebration. No date can be reserved until the pre-nuptial investigation has been completed.

Reconciliation: Sunday and Wednesday 10 minutes before mass, or by appointment.

Anointing of the Sick: Anointing of the Sick is for the comfort and strength of the ill, especially the aged. It is not just for those in the immediate danger of death. The sacraments are celebrated for the living. When someone you love is homebound or hospitalized, please let us know so arrangements can be made to minister to them.

Funerals: In the event of a death in your immediate family, please call the priest at St. Madeleine's Church (386)454-2358.

Membership Information: If you wish to become a member of the church, or to sign up for a church ministry, please pick up a registration form found at the back of the church, or call the church office. We can also email or fax forms.

Intentions for Loved Ones: If you would like to have a mass said for your loved one, sponsor the tabernacle light, or sponsor the mass hosts in memory of a loved one, please call or email the church office. **If your intention is for a specific date,** please call the office well in advance, as dates fill up quickly.

Twenty-third Sunday in Ordinary Time



The Twenty-Third Week of Ordinary Time

Sunday is the **Twenty-Third week in Ordinary Time**. As faithful followers, we are encouraged to “love one another” throughout the readings. **Ezekiel** tells us that we are responsible for each other and Paul’s letter to the **Romans** offers: “Owe nothing to anyone, except to love one another.” In **Matthew’s Gospel**, Jesus tells us to challenge each other on our behavior and to pray, “For where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them.” Thursday is the **Feast of the Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary**. Friday is the **Memorial of St. Peter Claver, S.J.**, a truly great Jesuit saint..

The first part of the week, the first readings are from the **Letter to the Colossians**. Paul is in prison, encouraging this community to put their trust in Christ, not mystical teachings and powers. He challenges them to live their baptism and to walk in the union they have with and in Jesus. Saturday we begin reading for Paul's **First Letter to Timothy**. The opening words boldly proclaim that Paul is the "foremost" among sinners and a sign of God's mercy.

In the first part of this week, following **Luke’s Gospel**, Jesus heals a man with a withered hand, on the Sabbath, in front of his religious critics. Then Jesus goes up on a mountain to pray and comes down to name his twelve apostles - all of whom seem to be unknown or questionable at best. The people bring all their sick to hear him and to be healed. Jesus tells them of their blessedness and warns them of the dangers. We can't be blind guides. We must have the humility to acknowledge and be forgiven our own sins before we can help others. Jesus tells us that our goodness will be seen in what we do and that our only security is in building our lives on him.

For the **Twenty-Fourth week in Ordinary Time** we are invited to reflect on how we forgive. Peter asks Jesus "how often" we must forgive, asking the extent of Jesus' call for mercy. The parable of the forgiven servant who can't forgive is meant to give us clear guidance for our lives as followers of Jesus: if we are forgiven, we must forgive others.

Patriot Day, September 11, 2011

Patriot Day is observed in the USA every September 11th to mark the anniversary of the terrorist attacks against the United States. The date falls on a Sunday in 2011, and this year's observance commemorating the 10th anniversary of the attacks will be a cause of much reflection and remembrance. To help clergy and pastoral ministers prepare for this anniversary, the Secretariat of Divine Worship offers a few considerations on how best to observe Patriot Day within the context of the Liturgy.

Sunday, September 11, 2011 will be the Twenty-Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time. All things being equal, the Mass of the day is celebrated, with appropriate intercessions and chants or other liturgical songs chosen to mark the observance of Patriot Day.

The assigned Lectionary reading for the Twenty-Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time (no. 130) are particularly poignant as they address questions of forgiveness, vengeance, and God's mercy. The first reading (Sirach 27:30-28:7) states "The vengeful will suffer the Lord's vengeance, for he remembers their sins in detail. Forgive your neighbor's injustice..." In the Gospel (Mt 18:21/35), Jesus addresses the question of forgiveness ("How often must I forgive?") with the Parable of the Unforgiving Servant.
